MEMORANDUM FOR THE HEADS AND ACTING HEADS OF EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES

SUBJECT: Regulatory Review Plan

The President Obama has asked me to communicate to each of you his plan for managing the Federal regulatory process at the outsetbeginning of his Administration. In order to ensure It is important that the President's President Obama's appointees and designees have the opportunity to review and approve any new or pending regulations, Lask on behalf. Therefore, at the direction of the President, Lam requesting that you immediately take the following steps:

- 1. Subject to any exceptions the Director or Acting Director of the Office of Management and Budget (the "OMB Director") allows for emergency <u>situations</u> or other urgent <u>situations circumstances</u> relating to health <u>and</u>, safety, <u>sendenvironmental</u>, <u>financial</u>, <u>or national security matters</u>, or <u>otherwise</u>, no proposed or final regulation <u>should be sent</u> to the Office of the Federal Register (the "OFR") <u>for publication</u> unless and until <u>it has been reviewed and approved by</u> a department or agency head appointed <u>or designated</u> by the President after noon on January 20, <u>2001</u>, <u>reviews and approves2009</u>, <u>or in</u> the <u>regulatory action.case of the Department of Defense</u>, the <u>Secretary of Defense</u>. The department or agency head may delegate this <u>power of review</u> and approval <u>power</u> to any other person so appointed <u>or designated</u> by the President, consistent with applicable law.
- 2. With respect to Withdraw from the OFR all proposed or final regulations that have not been sent to the OFR but not published in the Federal Register, withdraw them from OFR for review so that they can be reviewed and approval approved by a department or agency head as described in paragraph 1. This withdrawal is subject to exception as the exceptions described in paragraph 1. This withdrawal and must be conducted consistent with the OFR procedures.
- 3. With respect to Consider extending for 60 days the effective date of regulations that have been published in the OFRFederal Register but have not yet taken effect, temporarily postpone the effective date of the regulations for 60 days, subject to exception as the 2 exceptions described in paragraph 1-, for the purpose of reviewing questions of law and policy raised by those regulations. Where such an extension is made for this purpose, you should immediately reopen the notice-and comment period for 30 days to allow interested parties to provide comments about issues of law and policy raised by those rules. Following the 60-day extension:
- <u>a. for those rules that raise no substantial questions of law or policy, no further action</u> needs to be taken; and
- <u>b.</u> for those rules that raise substantial questions of law or policy, agencies should notify the OMB Director and take appropriate further action.
- 4. Exclude from the The requested actions set forth in paragraphs 1-3 do not apply to any regulations promulgated pursuantsubject to statutory or judicial deadlines and identify such exclusions to. Please immediately notify the OMB Director as soon as

possible.of any such regulations.

- 5. Notify the OMB Director promptly of any regulations that, in your view, impact you believe should not be subject to the directives in paragraphs 1-3 because they affect critical health-and, safety, environmental, financial, or national security functions of the agency and therefore should be also excluded from the directives in paragraphs 1-3. The department or agency, or for some other reason. The OMB Director will review anyall such notifications and determine whether an exception is appropriate under the circumstances.
- 6. Continue in all instances to comply with Executive Order 12866, pending our review of that order, as well as any otherany applicable Executive Orders concerning regulatory management. As used in this memorandum, "regulation" has the meaning set outforth in section 3(e) of Executive Order 12866. That is, of September 30, 1993, as amended; this planmemorandum covers "any substantive action by an agency (normally published in the Federal Register) that promulgates or is expected to lead to the promulgation of a final rule or regulation, including notices of inquiry, advance notices of proposed rulemaking, and notices of proposed rulemaking."

This regulatory review will be implemented by the OMB. Director or Acting Director of the OMB. Communications, and communications regarding exceptions any matters pertaining to the review, or questions regarding the review generally, this review should be addressed to that individual.official.

Finally, in the interest of sound regulatory practice and the avoidance of costly, burdensome, or unnecessary regulation, independent agencies are encouraged NB Director is authorized and directed to participate voluntarily in this review.
